Join us for a riveting afternoon with a survivor of the RMS Titanic, which sank on its maiden voyage from Southampton, England to New York. Hear her heartbreaking story, and what it was like to survive one of the worst maritime civilian disasters in recorded history.

From the glorious accommodations and excitement of launching a spectacular ocean liner, to the desperate decisions made during the sinking and the outraged public of the aftermath, you have a rare opportunity to hear first-hand what the infamous catastrophe was like for those who lived it.

Alisa Dupuy originated “The Ladies of History”, with historical presentations and first person portrayals in 2006 out of her love of the important women in world history. Wearing the clothing of different historical periods, she brings history to life in a lively and fun way.
